The following resolution was offered by Council Member Cognevich who moved its adoption:

1 A resolution giving preliminary approval to the issuance of not to exceed Fifty
2 Million Dollars (\$50,000,000) of Hurricane Recovery Revenue Notes of the Parish
3 of Plaquemines, State of Louisiana; and providing for other matters in connection
4 therewith.
5

6 WHEREAS, the Plaquemines Parish Council (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing
7 authority for the Parish of Plaquemines, State of Louisiana (the "Issuer"), desires to incur debt and
8 issue not to exceed Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000) of Hurricane Recovery Revenue Notes
9 (the "Notes"), in the manner authorized and provided by Section 1430 of Title 39 of the Louisiana
10 Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority (the "Act"),
11 for the purpose of (i) paying any costs associated with debris removal or the demolition,
12 rehabilitation, repair, reconstruction, renovation, restoration and improvement of the properties
13 and facilities within the Issuer resulting from or related to Hurricane Ida, including purchasing any
14 furnishings, fixtures and equipment incidental or necessary in connection therewith; (ii) funding a
15 reserve, if required; and (iii) paying the costs of issuance of the Notes; and
16

17 WHEREAS, the Notes shall be secured by and payable from a pledge of all funds or revenues
18 received or to be received by the Issuer to the extent legally available for the payment of debt
19 service on the Notes, provided that no such funds or revenues shall be so included which have
20 been or are in the future legally dedicated and required for purposes inconsistent therewith by the
21 electorate, by the terms of specific grants, by the terms of particular obligations issued or to be
22 issued or by operation of law (such amount being the "Available Funds of the Issuer"); and
23

24 WHEREAS, it is expressly provided that the full faith and credit of the Issuer shall not be pledged,
25 and there shall be no obligation on the Issuer to levy or increase taxes or other sources of revenue
26 in order to pay debt service on the Notes or to transfer any funds for the payment of debt service
27 that may result in a violation of any law, ruling, regulation, contract or agreement applicable to the
28 Issuer; and
29

30 WHEREAS, the Issuer has no outstanding notes or other obligations of any kind or nature payable
31 from or enjoying a lien on the Available Funds of the Issuer herein pledged;
32

33 NOW, THEREFORE:

34 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PLAQUEMINES PARISH COUNCIL (the "Governing Authority"),
35 acting as the governing authority for the Parish of Plaquemines, State of Louisiana, that:
36

37 SECTION 1. Preliminary Approval of Revenue Notes. Preliminary approval is given to the
38 issuance of not exceeding Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000) of Hurricane Recovery Revenue
39 Notes of the Issuer, pursuant to the Act, for the purpose of (i) paying any costs associated with
40 debris removal or the demolition, rehabilitation, repair, reconstruction, renovation, restoration and
41 improvement of the properties and facilities within the Issuer resulting from or related to Hurricane
42 Ida, including purchasing any furnishings, fixtures and equipment incidental or necessary in

43 connection therewith; (ii) funding a reserve, if required; and (iii) paying the costs of issuance of
44 the Notes, said Notes to be secured by and payable from the Available Funds of the Issuer. The
45 Notes will be issued in one or more series, each of which may be taxable or tax-exempt, shall bear
46 interest at an interest rate not exceeding 5% per annum, and shall mature over a period not
47 exceeding ten (10) years from the date of issuance. The Notes shall have such additional terms and
48 provisions as may be determined in a subsequent resolution of the Issuer.

49
50 SECTION 2. State Bond Commission. Application is hereby made to the State Bond
51 Commission, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, for approval of the issuance and sale of the Notes and for
52 consent and authority to proceed with the issuance and sale of the Notes as provided above, and
53 Bond Counsel is directed to make application to the State Bond Commission in accordance with
54 the foregoing on behalf of the Issuer. By virtue of applicant/issuer's application for, acceptance
55 and utilization of the benefits of the Louisiana State Bond Commission's approval(s) resolved
56 and set forth herein, it resolves that it understands and agrees that such approval(s) are expressly
57 conditioned upon, and it further resolves that it understands, agrees and binds itself, its
58 successors and assigns to, full and continuing compliance with the "State Bond Commission
59 Policy on Approval of Proposed Use of Swaps, or other forms of Derivative Products Hedges,
60 Etc.," adopted by the Commission on July 20, 2006, as to the borrowing(s) and other matter(s)
61 subject to the approval(s), including subsequent application and approval under said Policy of the
62 implementation or use of any swap(s) or other product(s) or enhancement(s) covered thereby.

63
64 SECTION 3. Employment of Bond Counsel. The Issuer finds and determines that a real
65 necessity exists for the employment of special counsel in connection with the issuance of the
66 Notes, and accordingly, Foley & Judell, L.L.P., of New Orleans, Louisiana, as Bond Counsel, is
67 hereby employed to do and perform work of a traditional legal nature as bond counsel with
68 respect to the issuance and sale of said Notes. Said Bond Counsel shall prepare and submit to the
69 Issuer for adoption all of the proceedings incidental to the authorization, issuance, sale and
70 delivery of such Notes, shall counsel and advise the Issuer as to the issuance and sale thereof and
71 shall furnish its opinions covering the legality of the issuance of the Notes. The fee of Bond
72 Counsel for each series of notes shall be fixed at a sum not exceeding the fee allowed by the
73 Attorney General's fee guidelines for such bond counsel work in connection with the issuance of
74 such series of revenue notes and based on the amount of said Notes actually issued, sold,
75 delivered and paid for, plus "out-of-pocket" expenses, said fees to be contingent upon the
76 issuance, sale and delivery of said notes. The Parish President is hereby authorized and directed
77 to execute, and the Issuer hereby agrees to and accepts the terms of, the engagement letter
78 appended hereto. A certified copy of this resolution shall be submitted to the Attorney General of
79 the State of Louisiana for his written approval of said employment and of the fees herein
80 designated, and the Finance Manager of the Parish is hereby empowered and directed to provide
81 for payment of the work herein specified upon completion thereof and under the conditions
82 herein enumerated.

83
84 SECTION 4. Underwriter/Placement Agent. Raymond James & Associates, Inc., of
85 New Orleans, Louisiana, is hereby appointed as underwriter/placement agent in connection with
86 the sale and delivery of the Notes, any compensation to be subsequently approved by the Issuer
87 and to be paid from the proceeds of the Notes and contingent upon the issuance of the Notes;
88 provided that no compensation shall be due to said underwriter/placement agent unless the Notes
89 are sold and delivered.

90 SECTION 5. Reimbursement. Prior to the issuance of the Notes, the Issuer anticipates
91 that it may pay a portion of the costs authorized to be paid from the proceeds of the Notes from
92 its available funds. Upon issuance of the Notes, the Issuer reasonably expects to reimburse said
93 expenditures from the proceeds of the Notes. Any such allocation of the proceeds of the Notes
94 for reimbursement will be with respect to capital expenditures [as defined in Treasury Regulation
95 1.150-1(b)] and will be made upon the delivery of the Notes and not later than 18 months after
96 the later of (i) the date such expenditure was paid or (ii) the date the improvements are placed in
97 service or abandoned, but in no event more than 3 years after such expenditure was paid. This
98 resolution is intended to be a declaration of intent to reimburse in accordance with the provisions
99 of Treasury Regulation 1.150-2.

The following resolution was offered by Council Member Cognevich who moved its adoption:

1 A Resolution giving supplemental approval to the issuance of not to exceed
2 Forty-Five Million Dollars (\$45,000,000) aggregate principal amount of
3 Revenue Refunding Bonds of the Parish of Plaquemines, State of Louisiana,
4 and providing for other matters in connection therewith.
5

6 WHEREAS, the Plaquemines Parish Council (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing
7 authority of the Parish of Plaquemines, State of Louisiana (the "Issuer") currently levies and
8 collects a one percent (1%) sales and use tax now being levied and collected by the Issuer (the
9 "Tax") pursuant to Article VI, Section 29 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974,
10 and other constitutional and statutory authority, said tax being authorized by an election held
11 therein on October 29, 1977; and
12

13 WHEREAS, the Issuer has heretofore issued its (i) Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2014 (the
14 "Series 2014 Bonds"), and (ii) Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2015 (the "Series 2015 Bonds"),
15 which are secured by the revenues derived from the levy and collection of the Tax; and
16

17 WHEREAS, the Issuer has also entered into a Loan Agreement dated as of September 1, 2012,
18 with the Louisiana Local Government Environmental Facilities and Community Development
19 Authority (the "LCDA") (the "2012 Coastal Bonds Loan Agreement") pursuant to which the
20 LCDA loaned the proceeds of its Revenue Bonds (Parish of Plaquemines Project), Series 2012
21 (the "Series 2012 Coastal Bonds") to the Issuer; and
22

23 WHEREAS, the Issuer has also entered into a Loan Agreement dated as of November 1, 2012,
24 with the LCDA (the "2012 Courthouse Loan Agreement") pursuant to which the LCDA loaned
25 the proceeds of its Revenue Bonds (Parish of Plaquemines Courthouse Project), Series 2012 (the
26 "Series 2012 Courthouse Bonds") to the Issuer; and
27

28 WHEREAS, in order to provide debt service savings, the Issuer desires to refund all or a portion
29 of the Series 2014 Bonds and the Series 2015 Bonds and its obligations pursuant to the 2012
30 Coastal Bonds Loan Agreement and the 2012 Courthouse Loan Agreement (collectively, the
31 "Refunded Obligations"), pursuant to the provisions of Part II of Chapter 4 of Subtitle II of Title
32 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory
33 authority (the "Act"), through the issuance of its refunding bonds; and
34

35 WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, and subject to the approval of the State Bond Commission, the
36 Issuer desires to accomplish the refunding through the issuance of not exceeding Forty-Five
37 Million Dollars (\$45,000,000) of its Revenue Refunding Bonds (the "Refunding Bonds"), to be
38 payable solely from and secured by the revenues derived from the levy and collection of the Tax;
39 and
40

41 WHEREAS, upon the issuance of the Refunding Bonds, the Issuer will have no outstanding bonds
42 or other obligations of any kind or nature payable from or enjoying a lien on the revenues of the

43 Tax pledged, EXCEPT the Issuer's (i) unrefunded Series 2014 Bonds, if any, (ii) unrefunded Series
44 2015 Bonds, if any, and (iii) Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2020 (collectively, the
45 "Outstanding Bonds").

46
47 WHEREAS, the Issuer desires to make formal application to the State Bond Commission for
48 approval of the Refunding Bonds, and further to employ professionals in connection therewith;

49
50 NOW, THEREFORE:

51 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PLAQUEMINES PARISH COUNCIL (the "Governing
52 Authority"), THAT:

53
54 SECTION 1. Preliminary Approval of Refunding Bonds. Preliminary approval is given
55 to the issuance of not exceeding Forty-Five Million Dollars (\$45,000,000) of Revenue Refunding
56 Bonds of the Parish of Plaquemines, State of Louisiana, pursuant to the Act, to be issued for the
57 purpose of refunding the Refunded Obligations, said Refunding Bonds to be payable, equally
58 with the Outstanding Parity Bonds, from an irrevocable pledge and dedication of the revenues to
59 be derived by the Issuer from the Tax, subject only to the payment of the reasonable and
60 necessary costs and expenses of collecting and administering the Tax. The Refunding Bonds may
61 be taxable or tax-exempt, will be issued at an interest rate not exceeding 5.00% per annum, and
62 shall mature not later than November 1, 2042. The Refunding Bonds shall be issued in fully
63 registered form and shall have such additional terms and provisions as may be determined by this
64 Governing Authority.

65
66 SECTION 2. State Bond Commission. Application is hereby made to the State Bond
67 Commission, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, for approval of the issuance and sale of the Refunding
68 Bonds and for consent and authority to proceed with the issuance and sale of the Refunding
69 Bonds as provided above, and Bond Counsel is directed to make application to the State Bond
70 Commission in accordance with the foregoing on behalf of the Issuer. By virtue of
71 applicant/issuer's application for, acceptance and utilization of the benefits of the Louisiana State
72 Bond Commission's approval(s) resolved and set forth herein, it resolves that it understands and
73 agrees that such approval(s) are expressly conditioned upon, and it further resolves that it
74 understands, agrees and binds itself, its successors and assigns to, full and continuing compliance
75 with the "State Bond Commission Policy on Approval of Proposed Use of Swaps, or other forms
76 of Derivative Products Hedges, Etc.," adopted by the Commission on July 20, 2006, as to the
77 borrowing(s) and other matter(s) subject to the approval(s), including subsequent application and
78 approval under said Policy of the implementation or use of any swap(s) or other product(s) or
79 enhancement(s) covered thereby.

21 WHEREAS, the Plaquemines Parish Clerk of Court and the Plaquemines Parish Council believe
22 that the Belle Chasse Middle School Gymnasium continues to be the most suitable and accessible
23 location for the Precinct 7-1 polling place to continue to be temporarily relocated for the
24 November, 2022, parish-wide election;
