1 A Resolution giving preliminary approval to the issuance of not to exceed Five
2 Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) of Hurricane Recovery Revenue Notes of the Parish
3 of Plaquemines, State of Louisiana, and providing for other matters in connection
4 therewith.

6 WHEREAS, the Plaquemines Parish Council (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing
7 authority for the Parish of Plaquemines, State of Louisiana (the "Issuer"), desires to incur debt and
8 issue not to exceed Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) of Hurricane Recovery Revenue Notes (the
9 "Notes"), in the manner authorized and provided by Section 1430 of Title 39 of the Louisiana
10 Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority (the "Act"),
11 for the purpose of paying existing essential functions of the Issuer's operations or expanding such
12 functions to meet disaster-related needs; and
13

14 WHEREAS, the Notes shall be secured by and payable from a pledge of all funds or revenues
15 received or to be received by the Issuer to the extent legally available for the payment of debt
16 service on the Notes, provided that no such funds or revenues shall be so included which have
17 been or are in the future legally dedicated and required for purposes inconsistent therewith by the
18 electorate, by the terms of specific grants, by the terms of particular obligations issued or to be
19 issued or by operation of law (such amount being the "Available Funds of the Issuer"); and
20

21 WHEREAS, it is expressly provided that the full faith and credit of the Issuer shall not be pledged,
22 and there shall be no obligation on the Issuer to levy or increase taxes or other sources of revenue
23 in order to pay debt service on the Notes or to transfer any funds for the payment of debt service
24 that may result in a violation of any law, ruling, regulation, contract or agreement applicable to the
25 Issuer;
26

27 NOW, THEREFORE:

29 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PLAQUEMINES PARISH COUNCIL (the "Governing Authority")
30 THAT, acting as the governing authority for the Parish of Plaquemines, State of Louisiana, that:
31

32 SECTION 1. **Preliminary Approval of Revenue Notes.** Preliminary approval is given to the
33 issuance of not exceeding Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) of Hurricane Recovery Revenue
34 Notes of the Issuer, pursuant to the Act, for the purpose of paying for existing essential functions
35 of the Issuer's operations or expanding such functions to meet disaster-related needs, said Notes
36 to be secured by and payable from the Available Funds of the Issuer. The Notes will be issued in
37 one or more series, each of which may be taxable or tax-exempt, shall bear interest at an interest
38 rate not exceeding 5% per annum, and shall mature over a period not exceeding twenty (20) years
39 from the date of issuance. The Notes shall have such additional terms and provisions as may be
40 determined in accordance with Section 4 hereof. It is expressly provided that the Notes may take
41 the form of a promissory note, loan agreement or other instrument and are not required to carry
42 the title "Hurricane Recovery Revenue Note" or other moniker.
43

44 SECTION 2. **State Bond Commission.** Application is hereby made to the State Bond
45 Commission, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, for approval of the issuance and sale of the Notes and for
46 consent and authority to proceed with the issuance and sale of the Notes as provided above, and
47 Bond Counsel is directed to make application to the State Bond Commission in accordance with
48 the foregoing on behalf of the Issuer. By virtue of applicant/issuer's application for, acceptance
49 and utilization of the benefits of the Louisiana State Bond Commission's approval(s) resolved and
50 set forth herein, it resolves that it understands and agrees that such approval(s) are expressly
51 conditioned upon, and it further resolves that it understands, agrees and binds itself, its successors
52 and assigns to, full and continuing compliance with the "State Bond Commission Policy on
53 Approval of Proposed Use of Swaps, or other forms of Derivative Products Hedges, Etc.," adopted
54 by the Commission on July 20, 2006, as to the borrowing(s) and other matter(s) subject to the
55 approval(s), including subsequent application and approval under said Policy of the
56 implementation or use of any swap(s) or other product(s) or enhancement(s) covered thereby.
57
58

59 SECTION 3. **Employment of Bond Counsel.** The Issuer finds and determines that a real necessity
60 exists for the employment of special counsel in connection with the issuance of the Notes, and
61 accordingly, Foley & Judell, L.L.P., of New Orleans, Louisiana, as Bond Counsel, is hereby
62 employed to do and perform work of a traditional legal nature as bond counsel with respect to the
63 issuance and sale of said Notes. Said Bond Counsel shall prepare and submit to the Issuer for
64 adoption all of the proceedings incidental to the authorization, issuance, sale and delivery of such
65 Notes, shall counsel and advise the Issuer as to the issuance and sale thereof and shall furnish its
66 opinions covering the legality of the issuance of the Notes. The fee of Bond Counsel for each series
67 of notes shall be fixed at a sum not exceeding the fee allowed by the Attorney General's fee
68 guidelines for such bond counsel work in connection with the issuance of such series of revenue
69 notes and based on the amount of said Notes actually issued, sold, delivered and paid for, plus
70 "out-of-pocket" expenses, said fees to be contingent upon the issuance, sale and delivery of said
71 notes. A certified copy of this resolution shall be submitted to the Attorney General of the State of
72 Louisiana for his written approval of said employment and of the fees herein designated, and the
73 Finance Manager of the Parish is hereby empowered and directed to provide for payment of the
74 work herein specified upon completion thereof and under the conditions herein enumerated.

75
76 SECTION 4. **Sale of Notes and Execution of Documents.** The authorization contained herein
77 is intended for use in connection with a Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA")
78 Community Disaster Loan for the Issuer. Subject to the approval of Louisiana State Bond
79 Commission, the Parish President is hereby authorized to accept an offer from FEMA and execute
80 any other documents as may be required with respect to said Loan, provided that the sale of the
81 Notes is within the parameters set forth in Section 1 hereof.

1 An Ordinance to establish divided precincts within Plaquemines Parish and to adopt
2 a redistricting plan for the Plaquemines Parish Council; and otherwise to provide
3 with respect thereto.

4 WHEREAS, the Plaquemines Parish Council is elected from nine single member districts in
5 accordance with the Charter for Local Self-Government of Plaquemines Parish; and

6
7 WHEREAS, the Plaquemines Parish Council determined that its districts were malapportioned,
8 after considering the 2020 Federal Decennial Census and new district lines needed to be crafted;
9 and

10
11 WHEREAS, the Plaquemines Parish Council, is unable to create a redistricting plan using the
12 whole precincts submitted to the United States Bureau of the Census and, in accordance with LRS
13 18:532.1(D)(2), will need to divide several precincts into two or more precincts, which divisions
14 shall be by a visible feature which is a census tabulation boundary, in order to accomplish
15 redistricting;

17 NOW, THEREFORE:

18 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PLAQUEMINES PARISH COUNCIL THAT:

SECTION 1

21 A. The Plaquemines Parish Council hereby divides and creates new precincts to be used in its
22 redistricting plan to be first implemented for all purposes related to the regularly scheduled
23 elections for the Plaquemines Parish Council, and otherwise, in the Fall of 2022.

24
25 B. Precinct 2-2 is hereby divided to create Precincts **2-2** and **2-2A**. Precinct **2-2A** is described
26 as follows: Begin at the intersection of Woodland Hwy. and LA Hwy. 23, which is also the
27 precinct boundary between Precincts 2-2 and 3-1, then proceed northwesterly along the
28 southernmost lane of LA Hwy. 23 (and the precinct boundary) to the intersection with a
29 fence line located north of Saxony Crt., then northeasterly along the fence line to the
30 intersection with Industry Canal, then southeasterly along the Canal to the intersection with
31 Woodland Hwy., then southerly along Woodland Hwy. to the point of beginning. The
32 remainder of the original Precinct **2-2** is redesignated as Precinct **2-2**.

33
34 C. Precinct 3-1 is hereby divided to create Precincts **3-1** and **3-1A**. Precinct **3-1A** is described
35 as follows: Begin at the intersection of Vogt Dr. and State Rte. 23, then proceed easterly
36 and southerly along State Rte. 23, which is also the boundary between Precincts 3-1 and 4-
37 1, then westerly and southerly and westerly and southerly along said boundary to the
38 intersection of the boundaries of Precincts 3-1, 4-1 and 4-2, then westerly, then southerly,
39 then westerly, then northerly to the intersection with an unnamed canal, which is the
40 boundary between Precincts 3-1 and 4-2, then northwesterly along the canal to the
41 intersection with the extension of a powerline running between Downing Crt. and Tinsley
42 Dr., then northerly along the powerline to the intersection with Demandre St., then
43 southeasterly along Demandre St. to the intersection with Oak Tree Rd., then northerly
44 along Oak Tree Rd., which becomes W. 3rd St., then northerly along W. 3rd St. to the
45 intersection with Hodge Ave., then westerly along Hodge Ave. to the intersection with
46 Vogt Dr., then northerly along Vogt Dr. to the point of beginning. The remainder of the
47 original Precinct 3-1 is redesignated as Precinct 3-1.

49 D. Precinct **4-1** is divided to create Precincts **4-1** and **4-1A**. Precinct **4-1A** is described as
50 follows: Begin at the intersection of Main St. and Ave. J, then northerly along Main St. to
51 the intersection with Oak Rd., then easterly along Oak Rd. to the intersection with E. 3rd
52 St., then southerly along E. 3rd St. to the intersection with Ave. J, then easterly along Ave.
53 J to the point of beginning. The remainder of Precinct **4-1** is redesignated as Precinct **4-**
54 **1**.

- E. Precinct **4-2** is divided to create Precincts **4-2** and **4-2A**. Precinct **4-2A** is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of the boundary between Precincts 6-1 and 4-2 and the Mississippi River, then proceed northerly along the Mississippi River to the intersection with the boundary between Precincts 4-1 and 4-2, then easterly and southerly along the boundary to the intersection with Apricot St., then easterly along Apricot St. to the intersection with a powerline, then southerly along the powerline to the intersection with Russell Dr., then easterly along Russell Dr., which is the boundary between Precincts 4-2 and 6-1, to the point of beginning. The remainder of Precinct **4-2** is redesignated as Precinct **4-2**.

- F. Precinct **5-2** is divided to create Precincts **5-2**, **5-2A** and **5-2B**. Precinct **5-2A** is described as that portion of the Precinct 5-2 lying south of the ship channel off of the intercoastal waterway, bounded on the east by the intercoastal waterway and on the west by Jefferson Parish. Precinct 5-2B is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of the southern bank of Barrier Canal and Good News Ave., then proceed, southerly along Good News Ave. to the intersection with I St., then northerly along I St. to the intersection with the boundary between Precincts 2-2 and 5-2, then northwesterly along the boundary to the intersection with Barrier Canal, then southwestly along Barrier Canal to the point of beginning. The remainder of Precinct **5-2** is redesignated as Precinct **5-2**.

- G. Precinct **6-1** is divided to create Precincts **6-1** and **6-1A**. Precinct 6-1A is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of Intrepid Dr. and Yorktown Lane, then proceed northeasterly along Yorktown Lane which is the boundary between Precincts 6-1 and 4-2, continuing along such boundary southeasterly, then southerly along Enterprise St., then continuing along the boundary as it becomes Rue Perez, then continuing along the boundary as it becomes Russell Dr., then continuing easterly along the boundary to the Mississippi River, then proceeding southerly along the boundary to the intersection of the Mississippi River and Sewer Plant Rd., then westerly along Sewer Plant Rd. to the intersection of the boundary between precincts 5-1 and 6-1, then northerly along the boundary, then westerly along the boundary, then southerly along the boundary, then easterly along the boundary, the northwesterly along the boundary, the westerly along the boundary, then northwesterly along the boundary, the northerly along the boundary as it becomes Rinard Ave., then northerly along the boundary, then easterly along the boundary, then northerly along the boundary as it becomes Midway Dr., then becomes Intrepid Drive, then northwesterly along Intrepid Dr. to the point of beginning. SECTION 2

The redistricting plan entitled Plaquemines Plan 2022 V2, as described below and more specifically depicted in the shape files and block equivalency files submitted to the Louisiana Secretary of State, be and is hereby adopted and such plan shall be utilized for the regularly scheduled elections in the Fall of 2022 for the Plaquemines Parish Council, in accordance with Louisiana law.

DISTRICT 1

District 1 consists of the entirety of precincts **1-1, 1-2, 1-3 and 6-1A.**

DISTRICT 2

District 2 consists of the entirety of precincts **2-1, 2-2A and 4-1A.**

DISTRICT 3

District 3 consists of the entirety of precincts **3-1 and 5-2B.**

DISTRICT 4

District 4 consists of the entirety of precincts **3-1A, 4-1 and 4-2A.**

DISTRICT 5

District 5 consists of the entirety of precinct **2-2 and 5-2.**

DISTRICT 6

District 6 consists of the entirety of precincts **4-2, 5-1, 5-2A and 6-1.**

DISTRICT 7

District 7 consists of the entirety of precincts **6-2, 7-1A and 8-1.**

DISTRICT 8

District 8 consists of the entirety of precincts **7-1, 7-2 and 8-2.**

DISTRICT 9

District 9 consists of the entirety of precincts **8-2A, 8-3, 9-1 and 9-2.**

SECTION 3

The Secretary of this Council is hereby authorized and directed to immediately certify and release this Ordinance and that Parish employees and officials are authorized to carry out the purposes of this Ordinance, both without further reading and approval by the Plaquemines Parish Council.
